If you are coming out to watch the event, please if it all possible, come out before 12.30 and not to park on Wharewaka Rd to save congestion on the cycle leg for the students.


## Growing Through Grief - Taupo

#### MEGAN'S SDR DREAM

We are fundraising to help our family member 15 year old Megan Hodgkinson go to St Louis Children's Hospital in the USA for SDR (Selective Dorsal Rhizotomy) surgery by top surgeon Dr Park in May 2018. This surgery is not performed in New Zealand.

Megan also requires follow-up rehab over an estimated 6 weeks following surgery.

The estimated total cost is \$120,000.

Megan (the third child in a family of 8) was born with diplegia cerebral palsy and over the years has courageously endured treatments but is deteriorating to the extent of being confined to a wheelchair if surgery doesn't take place.

This SDR surgery has successfully helped others including New Zealanders with this type of cerebral palsy to be able to walk

upright and experience life changing effects. This is our desire for Megan.
