She often is the only St Pats student or one of a small handful. There is a group of maybe 5-6 Taupo Intermediate students who catch the same bus. Every day without fail they say good morning to her, keep an eye on her while waiting for the bus, then let her and any other younger students board the bus first. All of this means catching the bus is a positive experience for our daughter and a positive start to her day. A credit to your students – I don't know their names but if positive behaviour on buses is acknowledged then they deserve some".
