Baz Haydon and myself left Taupo at 8am with this group bound for Auckland as invited guests on-board the Spirit of New Zealand berthed in the Auckland Viaduct.

Hyundai NZ is a proud sponsor of Spirit of Adventure and they were excited to share a day's experience on-board the ship for Taupo's aspiring leaders hosted by members of the Trust.

What a magnificent day it was, beautiful weather, ideal sailing conditions and all of us experiencing the thrill of sailing in the beautiful Hauraki Gulf.

There is an opportunity for our students when they reach the age of 16 years to apply for the 10 day adventure on this vessel so I am hoping that some of our students were inspired enough to keep this in mind.

The <u>tall ship</u> *Spirit of New Zealand* is a steel-hulled, three-masted <u>barquentine</u> from <u>Auckland</u>, <u>New Zealand</u>. It was purpose-built by the <u>Spirit of Adventure Trust</u> in 1986 for youth development. It is 42.5 m in total length and carries a maximum of 40 trainees and 13 crew on overnight voyages. The ship's home port is Auckland, and it spends most of its time sailing around the <u>Hauraki Gulf</u>. During the summer season, it often sails to the <u>Marlborough Sounds</u> and <u>Nelson</u>, at the top of the <u>South Island</u>.

The ship is used for a year-round programme of youth development, consisting primarily of 10-day individual voyages for 15- to 19-year-olds and 5-day *Spirit Trophy* voyages for teams of 10 <u>Year 10</u> students. Once a year an *Inspiration* voyage for trainees with physical disabilities is run, as well as board of trustees and Navy training voyages. In addition, adult day, weekend and coastal voyages are offered to paying members of the public. The ship is usually in dry-dock for refit in November and does not sail on Christmas Day.

Our sincerest congratulations to **Nicole Van der Kaay** who came 7th in yesterday's triathlon at the Commonwealth games on the Gold Coast – our first Kiwi home as well. 
