All students have been issued with a Stationery Pack regardless of whether they have been paid for or not, to ensure that students all start the same. Thank you to those who have paid – we will invoice those who haven't as yet.

We inform you that you must adhere to other requirements stated in our Prospectus and today I emphasise:-

#### THAT THERE IS ....

- No dyed coloured hair.
- No body piercing only studs in your ear.
- No cell phones to be used in our school they will be confiscated and kept locked away and you as a parent or caregiver will need to come to the office to pick it up. ALL communication should come through to you from our school office, or direct with the classroom teacher via email or phone call. Students can use our school phone at no cost to them or yourself.
- No visiting the school during school hours unless you check yourself in to the office area.
- School Donation This is the 4<sup>th</sup> Year that we <u>have not asked</u> for a donation and I don't hold out any hope the government will help in this regard as promised now or in the future? Technology fees and School associated activities such as school trips and sports fees are still payable by you. Again, please discuss directly with me if these costs are causing some hardship.

## THAT WE DO ...

- have a school uniform for day wear and physical education. Personal caps can be worn outside as sun protection, or there are school caps and hats for sale from Brandfuel. All uniform components need to be named – vivid marker is effective, and teachers can assist with this.
- Help with sunscreen we do make containers available but if you know your child needs special skin protection ie. 50 Plus then please ensure they have a tube in their bag. We have 24 classrooms and will endeavor to place 24 x pump pots in each class at our cost @ \$25.00 per litre.

### **SCHOOL LAPTOP SCHEME FOR 2019**

Thank you to all those who have signed and made their first deposit or paid fully for their new laptop. These will be issued to your child if you are part of the scheme within the next two weeks. **PLEASE NOTE: THIS SCHEME IS NOT COMPULSORY**Those of you who have signed up for the scheme need to keep up with the payments, you can discuss with our office staff

on payment options, including automatic payments, weekly or monthly.

• THE LAPTOPS REMAINS THE PROPERTY OF TAUPO INTERMEDIATE UNTIL THEY ARE PAID OFF IN FULL AND THEN ONLY WHEN THE STUDENTS LEAVES OUR SCHOOL.

250 laptops have arrived in our school. We now need to connect them to our school system to ensure that we are able to monitor their use for your child's protection, and adhere to our stringent rules and regulations.

When your child leaves our school, all programmes that are licensed to Taupo Intermediate will be removed and the laptop will revert back to what it was, at the delivery status to the school.

NO OTHER LAPTOP WILL BE ABLE TO BE CONNECTED IN ANYWAY TO OUR SYSTEM

**ALL** students who are not participants in the laptop scheme will have a Work Station made available in their class for their use during the school day.

• ALL STUDENTS WILL BE INVOLVED IN A SPECIALLY PREPARED CURRICULUM UNIT ON DIGITAL USAGE AND SAFE PRACTICES AS PART OF OUR HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS. Any breaches of our protocols will/could see the privilege of digital usage being withdrawn.

### SCHOOL BUS SERVICE FOR 2019

We have approximately 300 x students who have an exclusive opportunity to travel on a free bus service, which is provided by the Ministry of Education. This is because they live more than 3.2 kilometres from their nearest school that they can attend. This service is managed by Principals representing 5 x schools here in Taupo and district. *Bill Clarke*, is the current Chairperson of this management group, along with *Catherine Fraser who is the Bus Coordinator for the whole group*.

Each school has their own bus Coordinator and **Taupo Intermediate School's Bus Coordinator is Kerri Robinson** so all queries and correspondence about our school buses must come to Kerri for any action required.

• DO NOT CONTACT THE BUS COMPANY DIRECT AS THEY ARE OUR CONTRACTORS.

Bus students will receive a letter outlining their responsibility and we will have no hesitation in removing student/s from the service for what ever period we decide, if there are any breaches of the rules or regulations. Each school will deal with their own students, but the Management group reserve the right to make the final decision if required.

**ALL BUS STUDENTS** go to the school hall at the end of our school day, marked on a roll accordingly, and then escorted to their bus which is lined up in the school grounds, including the private service to Turangi. If they don't turn up to the hall, we mark them absent. If you make alternative arrangements for your child after school, you can contact the school office. We need to know who is and isn't on the bus, in the event of an emergency.
