They came to share their thoughts and thanks at our school assembly and were blown away with our Powhiri – our waiata and haka which they commented would give them the inspiration and strength to complete the Ironman. This was an awesome occasion which I am sure will be continued in Taupo for years to come.

Out of all the many letters and visits we have had over the past week, I wanted to share this letter with us all, to show how much of an impact writing letters to the Ironman Athletes has made.

Dear Mason

My Name is Rachael Turnbull and I am from Brisbane Australia. I received your wonderful letter in my race pack for the Taupo Ironman Triathlon and I wanted to write and thank you for taking the time and effort to write to us all. I am a part of SBR Triathlon, a Brisbane based Triathlon group that is owned and run by my older brother David and his wife Michelle. My brother was the one that inspired us all to even think we could do an Ironman in the first place. They had over a dozen athletes in Taupo on the weekend and we all were talking about how awesome it was to receive your letters. Taupo is an amazing place and the people there (you!) are sensational!

Just to let you know, I finished the Ironman Triathlon in 15 hours and 33 minutes. The swim was so beautiful and crystal clear. You all do an excellent job of looking after your beautiful waterways. The bike leg was incredible with the views, but it was pretty tough because of the strong gusty winds on the second lap. I thought the cows were sooo shiny! My coach (my big brother) says I should have been more focussed on racing faster, rather than looking at the cool cows and beautiful scenery – but hey - I loved it! The run was tough because we were so exhausted from the ride but that is when the race really starts. Your head and your tired body tells you to quit, but your heart and your determination to reach your goals kicks in. You would know how that feels because you are a runner. Running is hard work and you need to train at it and not quit! You can use that mental toughness you already have, to help you get through your senior years of High School when exams and assignments get hard.

The true Champion Ironman for me is our youngest son, Dominic, who did the Ironkids fun run. Dominic has Down Syndrome and he finds a lot of things really hard to do. But he always tries his best. He did the run and received a medal at the end. He is really happy about that and he now has 25 medals from doing fun runs and Special Triathlons! So when I am racing and I feel like quitting, I think of how lucky I am to be able to do these events. Just like you said in your letter, we are doing something that lots of people would love to do.



I took your advice and we all went to the Spa Park hot pools the day after the race and relaxed in there. It was awesome. You are lucky to live in such a beautiful place. We also saw Huka Falls, went jet boating, our eldest son (he is 21) went bungy jumping (too scary for me)! We also went to the Redwood Treewalk in Rotorua and saw the Thermal Springs. Thanks for having us in Taupo and thank-you again for the lovely letter. Study hard, run well and stay awesome!

On the Saturday our awesome staff played their part in this event by providing the service at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Leg of the Bike section organizing and handing out the Special Needs Bags which

contained the sustenance for the rest of their bike ride – So huge thank you to all of our staff and of course the many other volunteers who helped on the day.
