Tena koutou te whanau o tenei Kura, nau mai haere mai ki te Kura Waenga o Taupo, "te kura pai o Intermediate i Taupo" Greetings to all our families and welcome to Taupo Intermediate School – "the best Intermediate in Taupo".

<u>Hard Materials</u> - Year 8 students, during rotation 1 of Hard Materials, have made balsa wood dragsters. These cars will be competing in a drag-strip tournament next Monday lunch time. These dragsters were purchased from bruce@getkidsracing.com and are powered by soda/carbon dioxide canisters. The students' Dragsters will be attached to high tension wires that span the length of the hall. From a custom-built launching station, a trigger punctures cannisters embedded in the rear of the Dragsters and sends them hurtling down the wires – up to speeds of 140km/hr! An electronic timer will gauge the winner. Students learn the science of speed (aerodynamics, drag, mass, lift, and friction) and how to use tools, including scroll saw's and drill press's accurately and safety.



School Laptops - As of this week support for ex lease hp laptops bought through the school in 2015 and 2016 ceases. No new enrolments will be able to use these laptops on our system. Pupils already enrolled and using these laptops will still be supported until they leave the school. Desktops are available for pupil use or there is still an option of opting into the current laptop programme.

Toshiba laptops bought in 2017 will be phased out in 2020.

<u>Kids Greening Taupo</u> - On Tuesday evening, March 19th, our Kids Greening Taupo student leaders attended a talk by Ruud Kleinpaste (the bug man) at The Great Lake Centre. Ruud congratulated the four leaders who were chosen to represent our school. They are Toby Bowler, Kaegan Palmer, Chethani Wilegoda-Gamage and Larissa Nordstrom. Toby was also asked to deliver a speech to the crowd and he did exceptionally well. Our other school Kids Greening Taupo leaders were also in attendance. They are Catie Mitchell, Xanthia Ellis and Felicity Bridge. Miranda Allen and Freya Edwards were unable to attend.

Kids Greening Taupo is a community run project that has the mission of restoring biodiversity to Taupo. A group of 27 students will be involved in a number of activities during school time, including planting trees in areas of the school, making weta and gecko hotels, propagating plants and the maintenance of existing plantings.
