• BOT ELECTIONS – Nominations for candidates for the upcoming Board of Trustees Election are due before noon on Friday 31st May 2019. Our election date closes noon Friday 14th June 2019. Information about who is eligible is on the back of the nomination form. If you are not on the voting roll you must be nominated by a person who is. Correct school uniform

We are constantly reminding students of our consistent policy of wearing the correct uniform each day, including shoes. Use of Cell phones

Absences

The attendance at school is compulsory, but for any reason the students are absent it is in fact your responsibility to contact the school and explain the absence. Our teachers are required by law to mark your child's attendance - they have to enter the correct code of absence i.e. explained, unexplained, overseas holiday, medical, if we don't get this information they are marked as truant. These are recorded for the Ministry of Education, and also for the Truancy Service who work in conjunction with the Police Youth Aid and Child Youth and Family.


