They displayed their scientific investigation or invention and were interviewed by the judges.

This year was one of the most successful years we've had. Sophie Webber and Emma Speedy both received Highly Commended Awards. Julia Leusink won the Red Stag Award for the Best Timber related investigation. Angus Putt won the award for Best Intermediate Science Investigation, the Best Energy Related Investigation, and he won

the prize for 2nd Best In Fair - this included secondary school students. Angus came out with a significant amount of prize money - \$100 of this he donated to the school science programme.

Taupo Cycle Challenge/Bevan Docherty Award:
