New long-term strategy for COVID-19

You'll be aware that New Zealand will move to a new, long-term approach to COVID-19. These changes have been made based on public health advice and reflect high levels of immunity and declining case numbers across New Zealand.

This new approach will only result in minor changes to the way we operate.

The very positive news is that household contacts of a person with COVID-19 do not need to isolate, but instead are asked to complete a RAT test each day, for five days. Therefore, ākonga who are household contacts but test negative and do not have COVID-19 symptoms, should continue to attend. It is the best place for them to be so they can be engaged in their learning, and connected with their teachers, classmates, and friends.

Mask wearing is no longer required as from the government announcement.

All the other recommended public health measures will stay in place as we know they reduce the spread of infectious illnesses including COVID-19.

These include ensuring our indoor spaces are well-ventilated, maintaining good hand hygiene, encouraging everyone to cough or sneeze into elbows and, most importantly, staying home and getting tested if they have COVID-19 symptoms.

Thank you for your ongoing support in protecting our community.

On top of having to cope with Covid Protocols, we now expect that we will now concentrate on getting through the rest of this term and next and to do this we expect your support.

At Taupo Intermediate we will still require you to:

- **Sign in** at the office and only enter the school when you have an appointment.
- **Don't visit** classes during the school day.
- **<u>Contact us</u>** if your child is absent from school.
- A reminder that our school has a <u>NO PHONE POLICY</u> as stated in the prospectus. If it is necessary for your son/daughter to bring their phone to school, they must drop it to the front office when they arrive to school in the morning and collect it at 3pm. We will not be held responsible for phones that are not in our lockbox. Our teachers <u>will not be responsible</u> for looking after phones.

If your son/daughter is caught with their phone during school hours, it will be confiscated by a teacher and taken to the front office for parents to collect.

During the school day, should you or your son/daughter need to be contacted please do so via the school office on 07 378 8097.

We have a well-publicised school uniform in our Prospectus and expect our students to wear it at school. We have allowed other warm jackets to be worn to and from school but not at school.

Your cooperation with us will ensure we don't have inconsistencies in our school. We have several things to do in our school especially with all the activities we organize or participate in, so your support is essential.

During these stressful times we are providing more and more for our students:

- Food for breakfast and lunches
- Uniforms shoes, socks, polar fleeces, jackets jerseys
- Counselling and health services
- Financial support for our students who can't afford the various fees and resources for school.

Put this alongside the number of teachers who have illnesses, some high needs and high maintenance students to cope with every day and when they are absent, we don't have enough relief teachers to help us, so we are forced to "whangai - adopt" classes out for other teachers to look after for a day or several days.

<u>The things that we have been involved with and are to complete before the end of this term:</u>

- Our Kapahaka group has been practicing for a period, interrupted by Covid for our performances at the Powhiri at the 100
 Year Celebration of Intermediate Schools conference at Wairakei Resort on Monday 22nd August. A magnificent performance, with many positive comments coming from the many Intermediate Principals who were welcomed there. I thank Colin Rangi for supporting us at our Powhiri.
- All our Year 8s visited the 2 x high schools Tauhara and Taupo nui a Tia on to see what they had to offer for 2023.
- The week of 5th 9th September was the AIMS GAMES where we were represented by our outstanding Mixed Hockey team, our Year 8 A netballers, a team of Swimmers and Mountain bikers. With over 11,000 athletes competing in a huge number of sports it was good to be able to mix and compete in this fantastic tournament.
- I would also acknowledge **Taupō's Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Whakarewa Te Reo ki Tūwharetoa** who became the first kura kaupapa to win an **AIMS Games hockey title**.
- The **Kapahaka group** followed the powhiri at the conference with an excellent performance at the **Tuwharetoa Kapahaka** festival on **Tuesday 13th September.**
- Next week we are hosting the Mathsmatters competition on Wednesday 21st September for our Year 5 and 6s Contributing schools and the Year 7s and 8s competition on Thursday 22nd September.
