Don't let anyone tell you that the Tongariro Crossing is breeze and anyone can do it, because it is not a stroll in the park and for me personally I found the down-hill from Ketetahi Springs was worst then the uphill climb, particularly with my old "war wounds".

You need to be well prepared both physically and take into account the ever-changing weather conditions after all we were in the mountains. We experienced wind and rain, foggy conditions, as well hot sunshine all within the 7 hours of our walk.

I was surprized, well maybe not, to see on the track a number of people who were not well clothed or prepared. We saw some flimsy plastic covers for raincoats and a handbag carrier along with jeans and soft shoes just to name a few ill-prepared people.

I wonder what sorts of checks and balances are in place to ensure that people who take on this walk are well prepared?

Let's hope the ability for all of us to undertake this walk is not compromised by any accidents that might occur because of lack of preparation or checks and balances.
