ACROSS THE LAKE SWIM

This Saturday's Across the Lake Swim, swimming the 1km / 2km. Taupo Intermediate staff will collect all the race packs on Friday night, so if students could meet Megan Chapman and Kerri Robinson, at the race start (3 Mile Bay Boat Ramp) at 7.15am to collect their pack, prepare for the race and attend the briefing prior to the start. Students must have a wetsuit (minimum short john) which needs to have been washed in laundry detergent, rinsed, and dried before the event.

Kayakers: For any parent who wishes to borrow a kayak for supporting the 1 and 2km events, Teaching Staff will have some school kayaks etc at the 3 Mile Bay Boat Ramp on Saturday morning.

Kayakers must wear a lifejacket and are asked to bring a whistle and cell phone if possible. If those parents who offered to paddle their own kayak could please bring them to the event as we only have 12. We will also have several of our own staff supporting on the water.

The 2km kayakers must be on the beach at 3 Mile Bay boat ramp where the swimmers start at 7.30am. ready to get on the water for their safety briefing. The 1km kayakers must be on the beach at 3 Mile Bay boat ramp where the swimmers start at 7.40am ready to get on the water for their safety briefing.

This swim will be a test of courage and determination for many students. As such we ask that you support (verbally) and encourage all swimmers to steadily continue along the course. Though also ask, that students are not towed, or physically supported more than 3 or 4 times (none if possible) over the 1km. If you intend to follow your child, could you please also encourage and assist any nearby students.

Please ensure your child is well prepared, has had food and water, has vaseline for chaffing, warm clothing for after etc.
