### Community Relationships

We at Taupo Intermediate would like to think that we have a real positive relationship with our immediate neighbors but know from time to time that we have the occasional glitch.

We have a special working relationship with our neighbors at the hospital with us sharing their Geothermal resource and heating up our school buildings and swimming pool.

These are outstanding additional services to our school which allows us 24 hours heating at any one time and of course the Geothermal heating of our school pool. It is heated using geothermal power but is NOT geothermal or underground thermal water.

We have also installed heaters into the changing sheds so the transfer from the heated pool to the changing rooms is very comfortable. We will therefore be continuing to offer our students an extension to our swimming season with each class timetabled for 45 x minute lessons without leaving the school grounds.

I therefore request that you as parents encourage your child to take this opportunity to get involved in these extra lessons.

We are very privileged to be able to have these facilities and if we do not support then I will offer the pool to other schools in our area.
