They work with every school and many ECE centres in the Taupō township, providing free environmental education for tamariki, free professional development for teachers, and free community events.

Education Coordinator – Rachel Thompson Kids Greening Taupo (www.kidsgreeningtaupo.org.nz) along with Andrea Southgate Program Facilitator – Taupō Blue Light Ventures have been instrumental in driving projects in our school with the biggest being recovering ground in the "gully" near the front entrance and bordering onto properties in Rata Street.

A huge job with many trailers loads and trees being removed from this area – particularly the vines which have been strangling growth. Andrea has provided in this newsletter a comprehensive report and background as to why this mahi is important.

As well as the Kids Greening and Blue light, I wish to thank hold-heartedly all who have been involved in this massive programme, those in our school led by Megan Chapman and Mason Elliot and the teachers and students along with the support of the Taupo District Council and at times several volunteers who appear from time to time.

We often see many prominent people who have various views on Climate Change and looking after our environment, but it is us who need to take responsibility with our 'own backyard 'first before we jump on everyone else, and I believe we have made a significant contribution to our own back yard.

Kia ora, as you know we have been running our Blue Light sessions throughout this and last term. Our focus has been on wellness, the four walls of Hauora. When we look after our four walls, we ourselves can remain standing strong through the tough times and the good times, all that life has to throw at us.

This week we have teamed up with Kids Greening Taupo and have been restoring the gully and freeing the 50yr old trees from the Jasmine Jungle that have been strangling them. While you may look at this is just a weeding session, free labour this has been much, much more. We focus on the Whenua, the land, the roots, where you come from. Your ancestry is important to your journey through life. We talk about looking after our Taha Tinana – our physical wellbeing, keeping active. I can tell you that all 8 classes so far have well exceeded their 30minutes of exercise. That Jasmine and Ivy is strong and takes a lot of effort to pull out.

We worked on Taha Whanau – our family, class, social by helping each other cut and pull the jungle apart. The positive language, the teamwork, the competitiveness, the inclusion was impressive. The overall massive effort every student and teacher put in to make a huge team effort has been overwhelming and exceeded all expectations. This all helps regulate Taha Hinengaro – our Mental and Emotional wellbeing, some would say the most important of all. These two-hour sessions have been hard but the positivity and endorphins flowing at the end of each session was contagious.

Last but by no means least Taha Wairua – our Spiritual wellbeing, whatever you believe that to be I know that every student has left these sessions with spiritual ties to that gully. I cannot tell you how many times I heard a student saying, "I just saved that tree". Each class, each teacher and the whole school should be so proud of what we have achieved so far. We are not done. Keep watching this space.
