We are 4 x weeks from the end of the term and then the next minute we will be hanging up the Christmas decorations

In my opinion, speaking of Christmas, what a huge disappointment to hear our Covid Minister also Minister of Education inform us that if any one oversea has plans to come home for Christmas, then cancel them, after all the sacrifices we have made this year, the one time where we can bring our whanau together at Christmas we can't!!

This is why I have chosen my quote for this week about what home is and what it means to us all. I am quite frankly not interested in the excuse that we don't and won't have enough quarantine spaces when we can bring in sports teams, entertainers, people from other nations. Just get facilities up and running, get the vaccine programme up to actual speed and if we haven't enough vaccines then get some more in. At least if we can get the majority of us vaccinated, it would allow us to perhaps quarantine at our homes.
