MICHAEL PARKES, NUKUHAU RESIDENT, AUTHOR & VEXILLOLOGIST (COLLECTOR OF FLAGS) GIFTS HIS ENTIRE FLAG COLLECTION TO TAUPO INTERMEDIATE.

Mason Elliott has known Michael Parke since Lockdown 2020, when he approached him to help with a flag competition, he was planning on running at school.

Michael has helped ever since, by choosing flags from his extensive collection to fly during the competitions.

Michael began collecting flags in 2005, when he lived in Thames. He started with an Irish and Estonia flag, gifts from his brother on his travels. In 2007 he moved to Taupo, erected a flagpole, and began gradually acquiring flags. He purchased flags from shops around NZ and the world and even had flags specially made that he was unable to source. His obsession grew and grew. One year he spent almost \$9000 on flags from Aliexpress. In 2012 he published a book, 'FLY THE WORLDS FLAGS'. It took him 2 years to complete the research for the book and he thoroughly enjoyed the process. A second edition has also been published.

Sadly, due to continuing health problems, Michael has had to sell his house in Nukuhau and move into a care facility closer to his family in Auckland. He has generously gifted his entire collection of over 2000 flags, including handmade shelving and his flagpole, which he flew a flag upon every day, to the school.

Michael is so happy that his collection of flags is going to the school, where student's teachers and the public can continue to enjoy his flag collection and learn about different countries from around the world, including our own.



The Flag competition returns this term, the 7th run at Taupo Intermediate, with amazing prizes generously donated by local businesses. Michael Parke continues his involvement with the competition, and we will continue to honour 'The Flag Man's legacy.

<u>Cohen's selection into the NZ Mighty</u> <u> 11's BMX Test Team and his</u> <u> upcoming trip to Australia.</u>

The Mighty 11's Junior Test Team is an international cultural exchange with BMX Australia. The Trans-Tasman series is normally raced at the BMX NZ North Island Titles in New Zealand in October and a selected Australian BMX event.

Riders who are eleven years old from all over Australia & New Zealand are invited to compete against each other in trial day to establish the "Mighty Eleven" Team for that year.

There are two parts of the "Mighty Eleven" experience. Firstly, is to trial for the Mighty Elevens Team which Cohen did so well to achieve the fourth selection spot earlier this month on the 11th of March prior to the BMX National Champs in Hamilton.

Once successful the selected team race against the Australians for the "Mighty Eleven Trans-Tasman Trophy".

Secondly, is for all eleven-year-old boys & girls to race in the "Mighty Elevens Special Class" to establish the overall "Mighty Eleven" rider.

The teams are normally billeted with local families, however due to the COVID-19 pandemic the "Mighty Elevens" teams have been unable to travel to Australia or New Zealand for the last few years and with the boarders only recently opening again, the selected children will all have at least one parent travelling alongside them for support on the eight day tour.

The international exchange started some 30 years ago, when a rider from the Ipswich BMX Club in Brisbane was tragically killed in a car accident. His mother gave the club a trophy to be used in his memory. A close friendship between the president of the Ipswich BMX Club & some New Zealand members, meant a vision was built out of their love of BMX and for a Trans-Tasman BMX exchange to begin.

Cohen will travel to Brisbane, Australia for eight days in on 4th April, to bond and train with his new teammates before competing on the 8 & 9th of April at the Oceania Championships held at the Sleeman BMX facility in Brisbane.

This is an amazing experience & one that many young BMX Racers aim towards that are coming through the younger BMX age groups in both countries.

The Oceania Championships is fast approaching, and Cohen is determined to train hard and make sure he is at peak fitness for the Trans-Tasman event.

Adding to Cohen's excitement is the opportunity to face the Aussies and perform a NZ Team Haka

before displaying their prowess on the track at the Championships.

Cohen is super excited and honoured to be selected for the Mighty 11's Test Team and just wants to race well representing his country and Taupo while doing the best he can.
