As we are still in the "orange" level we do still have some protocols that we need to adhere to when you want to visit our school.

- **STOP!!** ALL VISITORS PARENTS, CONTRACTORS to the school must firstly report to the administration office and sign in please.
- There are no visits to classrooms during class hours. Any interviews must be set up at the front office.
- We request that when you enter our office area you wear a mask. Many of us still work or visit a whole lot
 of different places and as Covid is still active in our community we ask you to help protect our staff and
 students.
- Mask wearing in our school is not mandatory but is encouraged and any staff member or student will be supported with their free choice.
- All our other protocols of washing hands and using hand sanitizers will continue in our school. This will also help with keeping down the numbers of flu and other winter ailments at bay.
- If students or teachers are exhibiting any cold of flu like symptoms, they will be asked to stay home. Please don't send children to school who say they are unwell with a "if you don't improve during the day then you can come home". By then it will be too late.

The local District Health Board / nurses have asked that we remind parents that they have been sent permission letters home for MMR – Measles, Mumps and Rubella – Vaccinations. Can you please fill the response form in whether you want your child to get vaccinated or NOT – a nil response is totally acceptable. Today your child will be given another letter asking for your permission for your child to vaccinate. THIS VACCINATION HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH COVID.

LOOKING BACK:

LOOKING AHEAD:
