Dear parents, caregivers, students, families, and the wider community. E nga mātua, e nga kaitiaki, e nga tauira, e nga whānau, me te iwi whānui.

Welcome back to everyone! Term two is underway, and our students have quickly settled back into school and classroom routines. The major focus for our students this term is to know where they are at in their learning, especially knowing their levels in reading, writing and mathematics and the next steps they need to take to accelerate their learning.

As you would have seen in the media earlier this week, the Government announcements related to some of their key initiatives for education - 'Phones Away for the Day', and Attendance. The 'Phones Away for the Day' is focused on eliminating the use of mobile phones at school. You may remember at the end of 2023, Taupō Nui-A-Tia College, Tauhara College and Taupō Intermediate School sent out a survey to our community. A letter was sent at the beginning of this year outlining our expectations. The TIS model of students not being allowed phones at school has been in place for several years. Students are encouraged to hand their phones in to the office each day. If students decide to keep their phones in their bags, then they are not to be taken out during school hours. If they are, then they will be confiscated and then returned to the child's parent/caregiver when they come to the office to collect it. Overall, this procedure works for our TIS students and families with minimal disruption to teaching and learning. Your support reinforcing this would be appreciated.

The second announcement was targeting attendance 'Everyday Matters'. The Ministry of Education over the last few years has adjusted the attendance target. The target now is for all NZ school students to achieve 90% attendance rates. We know that if students aren't at school, teachers can't teach them, and students can't learn. At TIS our attendance rate generally sits around the 85% mark each term. While we are not guite making the Ministry of Education's target figure, we are not too far off. How can we achieve 90% attendance Target? School to provide a safe, caring, and fun learning environment for students with a wide range of extra curricula activities to engage them in. Parents/Caregivers - With the colder and wetter months coming, ensure that your child is kept warm and dry and has the essential school uniform for terms two and three. Together we can strive to achieve the 90% target.

- Everyone returning to TIS for another exciting term.
- 'Technology Excellence Awards for Term 1' were presented to our students for their outstanding achievement in Science, Food Technology, Visual Arts and Soft Material at school assembly.
- Newly refurbished science room being available for technology classes.

- Student leaders being actively involved in organising upcoming school events such as Pink Shirt Day and lunchtime activities.
- Production practises getting underway.
- Students challenging themselves to make the EPro8 teams.

It's hard to believe that I have completed one year at this fantastic school. It just seems like yesterday that I started. I am looking forward to another exciting and busy term at Taupō Intermediate School. As always, thanks for your ongoing support to make TIS the best for your child and our students.




KIWI KIDS COMPETITION

- Stopping at all stop signs and red lights.
- Signalling turns and giving way to pedestrians.
