Each question was 45 seconds long. After the individual test finished, we all walked back to the hall. Once we got back to the hall, the year sevens and eights made a switch; the year sevens would now be doing the individual test while the year eights attempted the team event.

The team event was exciting and fun. After completing the individual test and the team challenge, the year sevens and eights met together for the prize giving. During the prize giving the awards for first, second, and third were given out for the individual and team prizes.

In the Girls' Division:


