Taupō Transport Network Group (TTNG) – School Bus Service

Kia ora Parents, Caregivers

We would like to take a moment to clarify the guidelines regarding our TTNG - School Bus Service. Our Tranzit bus service is funded by the Ministry of Education to transport students from their place of residence to school and back, provided they live more than 3.2km from the school.

Unfortunately, this service does not extend to additional drop-off requests such as visits to friends' houses, grandparents' homes, or other family members, nor can it be used for trips into town or other extra stops.

Due to the high demand and the full capacity of our current routes, we are unable to accommodate any additional stops beyond the designated residential addresses. With over 300 students currently using the bus service, and the buses operating at full capacity, it is essential that we adhere strictly to the designated routes to ensure the safety and timely arrival of all students.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter. If you have any questions or need further clarification, please feel free to reach out.

Bus Fob Update

Due to the increase in the number of students using the bus service in 2025, we are currently waiting for additional bus fobs and retractable lanyards for the remaining bus riders. We expect these to be available by Monday, March 31.

We kindly encourage all students to take care of their bus fobs and avoid attaching them to the exterior of their bags. In the event a bus fob is lost, it can be replaced for a fee of \$10.00.

REMINDER: All students are required to have their bus fob in order to travel on the TTNG – School Bus Service.

HUT BUDDIES WANTED!!

Want to make a positive difference for outdoor education at your school ...?

Memorial Hut <u>www.memorialhut.co.nz</u> is an amazing outdoor education resource that was gifted to the Central Plateau Schools Alpine Charitable Trust (CPSAT) by the Auckland Tramping Club in 2018. Located in the Whakapapa Village on Mount Ruapehu, the 32-bed hut provides a self-catering base within a stunning alpine location. The hut is used for a range of outdoor education activities including class trips, ski teams, leadership programs, snow survival training, Duke of Edinburgh expeditions and team-building.

Our school is one of three Taupō schools – Waipāhīhī, Taupo Intermediate and Taupo-nui-a-tia – that collectively operate the Trust. The Trust itself is comprised of a volunteer board of six trustees, with school management and staff supporting operations. The hut needs regular spring cleans and maintenance – it's a pretty harsh environment at 1,600m above sea level! – and the Trust is also in the process of undertaking some major upgrades to deliver a warmer, drier and more comfortable stay.

The Trust is looking to assemble a group of 10-15 outdoor education enthusiasts from member school communities keen to help maintain and develop this unique resource. "Hut Buddies" will be invited to:

- Volunteer for a hut check-up roster a good excuse to enjoy a walk or ski while you're up there!
- Help with "spring" cleans and working bees, typically held once or twice a year.
- Support fundraising efforts and leverage relevant networks.

In return, Hut Buddies will enjoy great company amidst breath-taking views, connect with fellow outdoor and education enthusiasts, and have the opportunity to hire Memorial Hut after school / education group bookings have been locked in. Most importantly, Hut Buddies will help ensure this great outdoor education resource remains available for their own children and for future generations. Note that Hut Buddies will be required to sign their school's Code of Conduct, and comply with Trust policies and hut user rules. An initial briefing will be held in February, and the first working bee will be scheduled in late February / early March.

- 5. A brief statement on why you want to be a Hut Buddy
- 6. Any super powers or technical skills you can contribute. For example, if you have a trade skill, are an admin extraordinaire, love fundraising, have design flair, IT skills, or are experienced in EOTC, we'd love to know about that. Enthusiasm, availability and manual labour is a perfectly good answer too!
