children Milos and cereals before school?






EPro8 Extension - Some of the creative models our students have built using the EPro8 Kit.

Holly's Maths groups - Working on Place Value, Regrouping and Addition with Algorithms.




## T.I.S STAFF NEWS

# Important changes to <u>KIWI KIDS</u> <u>SPONSORSHIP</u> funding renewals

We're writing to let you know about an important change to the way families renew their child's Kiwi Kid Sponsorship (KKS) funding. From June 2025, all renewals must be completed online by the child's primary caregiver via the Variety website. This means School Champions will no longer be able to submit renewals on behalf of families.

This change has been made to ensure that caregivers personally accept the new Child Sponsorship Agreement, agree to our Privacy Policy, and confirm they understand and will follow the KKS programme rules. As part of the renewal, families must now also provide a valid Community Services Card (CSC) as proof of financial eligibility. These steps help us protect privacy, ensure funding is used appropriately, and maintain the integrity of the programme.

We know this is a shift from previous years, and we're incredibly grateful for the support you continue to provide in guiding families through this transition.

School Champions can help caregivers in their school community renew their child's funding if they need support, or you can suggest they contact Variety if they have any questions.
