### He Kāhui Tāngata Trust

He Kāhui Tāngata Trust offer one on on community mentoring for young people aged between 9-13 years. The tamaiti is matched one on one with a safe and trusted adult.

All mentors are volunteers and must have attended an "Introduction to Mentoring workshop" and passed a police vetting clearance.

The tamaiti spends up to two hours each week participating in various, fun, new activities with their mentor.

We aim to offer the tamaiti new experiences and allow a safe space for them to be themselves.

Agencies, school and whanau can refer a tamaiti to the program.
