Stay Connected with the HERO App

Taupō Intermediate uses the HERO app as our Student Management System. This is our main source of communication between school, parents/caregivers, and students.

I encourage all parents, caregivers, and extended family members to download and log in to the HERO app for Taupo Intermediate. This is essential to keep you well-informed of school happenings, alerts, and events.

School Bus Transport Information

We are currently developing our school bus lists for the different routes provided by the Taupō Transport Network Group and Tranzit. We will be formalising these lists by the end of next week, which includes checking the eligibility of students to use this service.

Please Note: This service is only provided for students living more than 3.2 km from the school.

Student Placement Our Deputy Principals have finalized class lists using previous school records and student preferences. Please note that late enrolments may not have received their specific friend requests. We ask that you allow a few weeks for your child to settle in. Experience shows that once initial nerves subside, students form positive relationships quickly. If you still have concerns after this period, we will review placements at the start of **Week 3**.

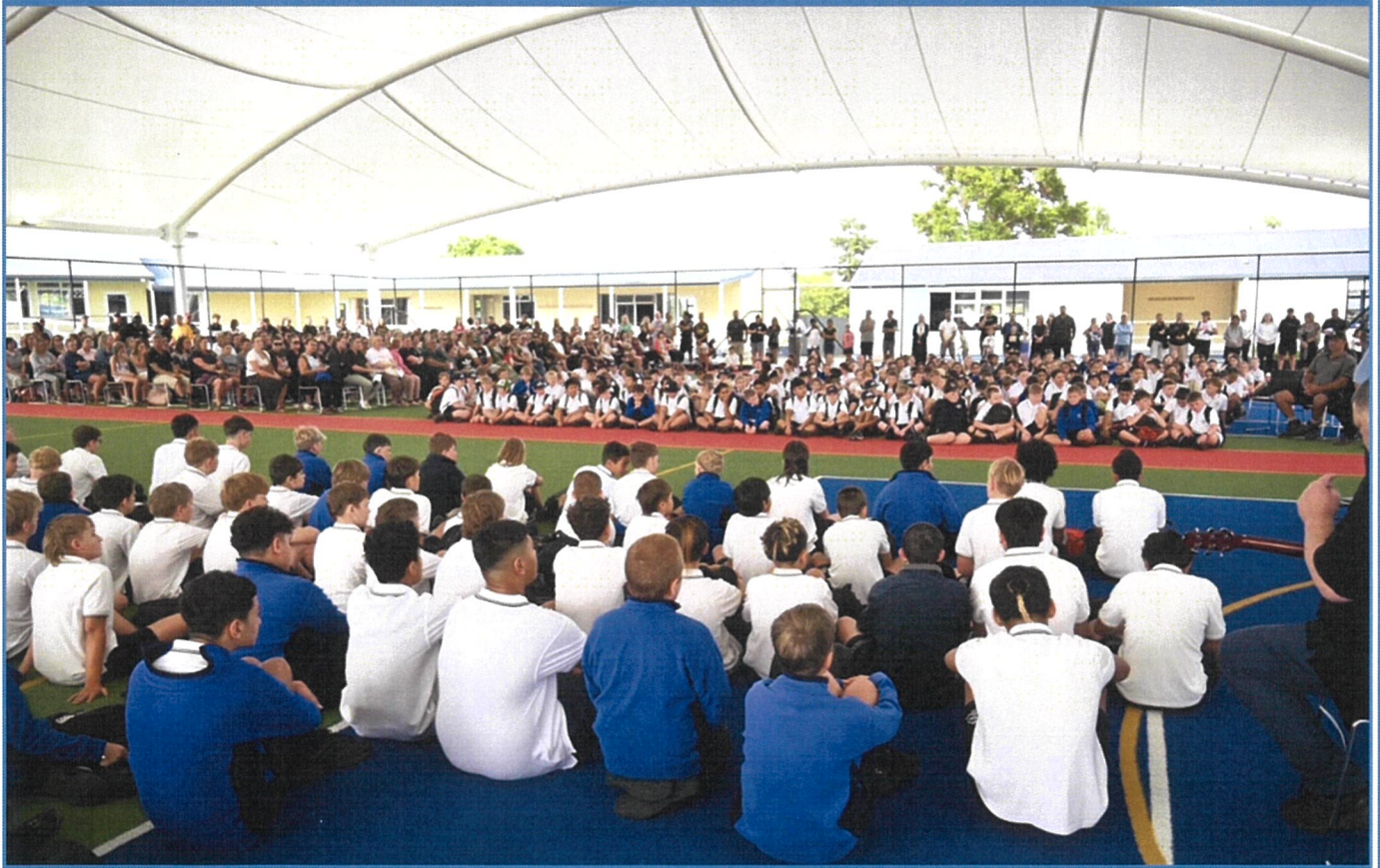








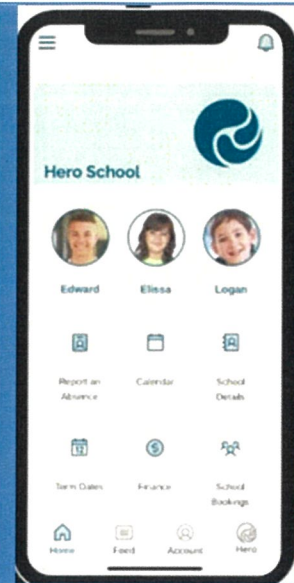
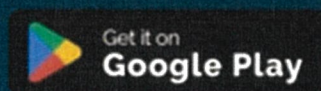

If you download the HERO app and when it asks you for a password just click forgot password and you can submit a new one. If you just use your email address you have given the school.

Ready, Set, Sign In!

Hero's sign in flow is safe and secure, with access controlled by the school. If you're a caregiver at a Hero school, stay in the learning loop by following the steps below.

1. Go to the Hero App

Select the relevant link below to download the Hero App, or click to login via a browser.



2. Add your email address

Then select "Next".

3. Select "New User"

Your account will be set up by your school using the email address that you provided when you enrolled your children. Use this address to request a password.

4. Select "Submit"

Hero will send you an email with a link to follow.

5. Check your email

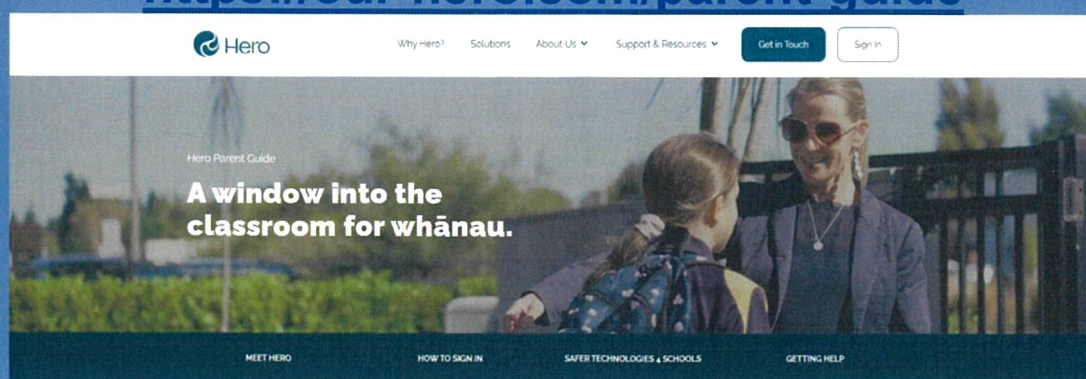
You should receive an email within five minutes.

6. Follow the link

This will take you to a secure page to enter your chosen password.

Catching the school bus to and from Taupo Intermediate School

The Ministry of Education (MOE) sets all school bus routes and policy for school transport eligibility.

To be eligible to travel free on the Taupō Schools Network Service you must live further than 3.2 km (shortest walking route) away from Taupō Intermediate School.

All eligible students will be allocated the required bus fob when signing up to the bus service when starting at Taupō Intermediate School.

This information is recorded for emergency action and as a roll for who is travelling on the bus each day.

Tranzit Coachlines is our locally appointed school bus service provider for Taupō Schools Network.

Our current bus routes are:

- o Wairakei
- o Kinloch
- o Nukuhau Shops
- o Richmond Heights
- o Waitahanui
- o Tukairangi Rd/Acacia Bay (Top shops). Includes Mapara Rd up to Tukairangi Rd
- o Napier-Taupo Rd & Nga Roto
- o Tirohanga
- o Aratiatia – Includes SH5 North of Taupo to beginning of Tram Rd, View Rd & Cnr of Broadlands & Whites Rd
- o Mapara Rd – North of Tukairangi Rd
- o Oruanui
- o Western Bay/SH32 – Includes SH1 north of Taupo, Palmer Mill Rd & Rangatira Point

Turangi Bus Service – Turangi Rentals

As there is no *school bus* from Turangi to Taupō, students must use the private bus company from Turangi and pay for a concession card. This bus drops off and collects students from our school.

Other information:

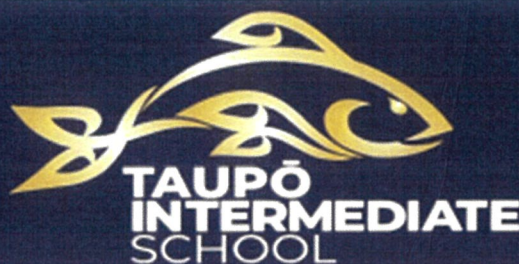
Eligible bus students are only allowed to travel to their parents/caregiver's place/s of residence. They are not to use other buses for personal use.

No Free Rides from Taupō Intermediate to Taupo-Nui-A-Tia or any other location in town. If this happens, students will be asked to leave the bus.

Regular bus users are not allowed to take a friend on the bus for a visit for an afternoon, weekend, or other activities. Please organise other means of transport for these friends wanting to come visit.

In case of an emergency please contact bwoods@taupointermediate.co.nz to discuss a possible solution to these bus related issues.

Students Travelling on School Buses

Transport assistance is provided as a privilege for eligible students, and not a right. Your Principal may withdraw that privilege if you misbehave.

ELIGIBILITY

- For Year 7 and Year 8 students who are living more than 3.2 km from the nearest school.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Use common sense and courtesy.
- Behave appropriately.
- Look after yourself and others.

The caregiver and the student should ensure they have read and understood the behavioural expectations outlined below. They need to be adhered to for the safety and comfort of all travelling on the school bus.

Please note: When there are no behavioural issues evident, there will be no need to put a 'Code of Conduct Agreement' into practice.

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

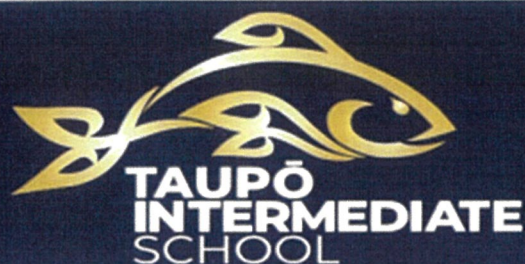
- When I am a seated passenger, I will remain in my seat for the whole journey.
- I will not eat on the bus or throw anything inside or out of the bus.
- If I am a standing passenger, I will stand quietly and not push or move around the bus.
- I will respect other students and their property at all times (this includes pushing, verbal or physical abuse, or any other behaviour that may distract the driver).
- I will use socially acceptable language when conversing with the driver and/or other students and I will not speak at a volume that may distract the driver.
- I will respect the property of the Bus Operator at all times (e.g. refraining from standing on seats or vandalising the vehicle in any way).
- I will not engage in any behaviour that could put the driver and other students at risk.
- I will observe the requirements and instructions of the Bus Driver and the teacher/s responsible for bus duty at all times.
- I understand that any damage I cause to the bus will result in my caregiver being billed for the cost of repairs.
- I must have written permission from my Caregiver to the Principal or Bus controller, if I wish to get off the stop other than my usual one.
- The bus must have stopped moving before I get on or off.
- When off the bus, keep well clear, especially when it is being reversed or turned.

APPROPRIATE BUS BEHAVIOUR IS AN EXPECTATION AT TAUPO INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL

Processes are in place for managing unsafe or unacceptable bus behaviour when they occur.

Caregivers are notified regarding incident reports.

Repeated incidents of unsafe or inappropriate behaviour from individual students may result in the student being banned from travelling on the bus for a period of time.

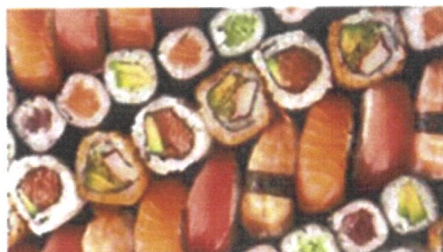

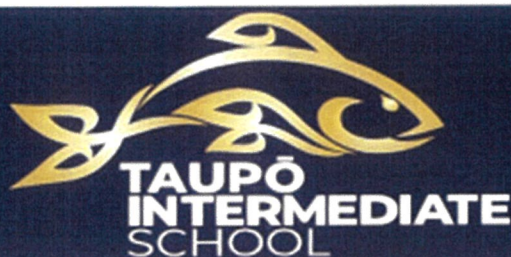
