School Based Immunisations

Update on 2026 School-Based Immunisation Programme for Year 7 & Year 8 Students

Kia ora Parents / Caregivers,

We would like to inform you of some upcoming changes to the school-Based Immunisation Programme (SBIP) for Year 7 and Year 8 students, which will come into effect in 2026.

As part of national changes to the immunisation schedule, **Year 7 students will now be offered both their Boostrix (tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough booster) and HPV (human papillomavirus) vaccinations at the same time.**

Year 8 students, in 2026 will continue to receive their scheduled HPV doses, as per current guidelines.

What this means for your school:

- 2026 will be a busier year for the immunisation programme as we transition to the new model.
- Additional clinic dates or longer clinic times and coordination will be required to ensure smooth delivery.
- We will work closely with you to plan effectively and minimise disruption to classroom learning.
- From 2027 onward, the programme will be more efficient, with fewer visits and interruptions to learning time.

Consent Forms:

For Year 8: They will receive a consent form for HPV only.

For Year 7: Please note that consent forms for year 7 will look slightly different, as they will now include both immunisations (Boostrix and HPV) on a single form.

Please complete the consent form and return it to school ASAP.

We understand the additional time and support this may require from your school during the 2026 transition year, and we are committed to working closely with your team to minimise disruption and maintain a smooth process for staff, students, and whānau.

Your child will be given a consent form to bring home for you to choose whether to have your child immunised by the Public Health Nurses at school.

- Information on the immunisations is included on the consent form which will be given to your child at the information session.
- Please complete the consent form and answer all the questions and return the form to school.
- If your child is not being vaccinated at school please complete section B and return the form to school
- Please check with your doctor or practice nurse if you are unsure if your child has had a tetanus injection in the last two years. Our PHN's will however check this prior to administration at school.

If you change your mind at any time regarding immunisation, please contact the Public Health Nurse below.

If you have consented and your child is away on the day of vaccination, they will be offered a catch up within 4 weeks

Buses – We have updated information that Students will not require bus tags/fobs this year.



Catching the school bus to and from Taupo Intermediate School

The Ministry of Education (MOE) sets all school bus routes and policy for school transport eligibility.

To be eligible to travel free on the Taupō Schools Network Service you must live further than 3.2 km (shortest walking route) away from Taupō Intermediate School.

All eligible students will be allocated the required bus fob when signing up to the bus service when starting at Taupō Intermediate School.

This information is recorded for emergency action and as a roll for who is travelling on the bus each day.

Tranzit Coachlines is our locally appointed school bus service provider for Taupō Schools Network.

Our current bus routes are:

- o Wairakei
- o Kinloch
- o Nukuhau Shops
- o Richmond Heights
- o Waitahanui
- o Tukairangi Rd/Acacia Bay (Top shops). Includes Mapara Rd up to Tukairangi Rd
- o Napier-Taupo Rd & Nga Roto
- o Tirohanga
- o Aratiatia – Includes SH5 North of Taupo to beginning of Tram Rd, View Rd & Cnr of Broadlands & Whites Rd
- o Mapara Rd – North of Tukairangi Rd
- o Oruanui
- o Western Bay/SH32 – Includes SH1 north of Taupo, Palmer Mill Rd & Rangatira Point

Turangi Bus Service – Turangi Rentals

As there is no school bus from Turangi to Taupō, students must use the private bus company from Turangi and pay for a concession card. This bus drops off and collects students from our school.

For information regarding the Turangi buses, please contact Turangi Rentals on 07 3868226.

Other information:

Eligible bus students are only allowed to travel to their parents/caregiver's place/s of residence. They are not to use other buses for personal use.

No Free Rides from Taupō Intermediate to Taupo-Nui-A-Tia or any other location in town. If this happens, students will be asked to leave the bus.

Regular bus users are not allowed to take a friend on the bus for a visit for an afternoon, weekend, or other activities. Please organise other means of transport for these friends wanting to come visit.


