Property & Facilities Update

We are committed to continuously improving our environment to provide the best possible space for our Tamariki. We have some exciting progress to share:

- Swimming Pool: I am thrilled to announce that the pool filtering system replacement is now complete. This means students will have access to the pool very soon!
- Roofing Projects: The Ministry of Education has approved the roofing replacement for Room 1–11.
- Rooms 7–11: Work scheduled for the April holidays.
- Rooms 1–6: Work scheduled for the July holidays.
- Carpet Replacement: We have also received approval for classroom carpet replacements, with the specific timing still being negotiated.

TAUPŌ TRANSPORT NETWORK GROUP

Temporary Change to Bus Transfer Location

Following the recent fire at Taupō-Nui-a-Tia College, we have been advised that, for the next two weeks, demolition work will be taking place on the damaged area of the site. During this time, heavy vehicles will be using the back entrance, which means the current bus transfer location is not considered appropriate or safe.

As a result, we have had to temporarily relocate the bus changeover point.

For the next two weeks, all bus transfers will take place at Owen Delany Park.

Tranzit has been working closely with Council and our team to ensure that this change of venue is safe and that bus operations can continue smoothly. We will also ensure that staff are present at Owen Delany Park to support students during the transition and changeover process.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation while this temporary arrangement is in place.

Student safety remains our priority, and we will keep the community informed if there are any further updates.




To Parents/Guardians of Taupo Intermediate School students:

Your child will attend the Taupo Hospital Dental Clinic for their examinations and any treatment required. Children will be called over from school in small groups for an initial exam appointment.

Consent forms will be issued if your child requires dental treatment. Please complete and return to the school office as soon as possible.

Year 8 students will also bring home a second form to be completed, as from year 9 they will be transferred into the care of a Dentist of your choice in town. This service is still free until they are 18 years of age.




