Kia ora parents, caregivers and whānau,

We have now reached the midway point of Term 3. Just when it feels like things might start to slow down after a busy few weeks of Student Conferences, DanceNZMade, BandQuest, Saturday morning netball, and the conclusion of our after-school netball and hockey competitions, we find ourselves heading into another exciting and action-packed five weeks.

There is certainly plenty happening across our school. Upcoming events include our Community and Māori Whānau Hui, Year 8 visits to local secondary schools, production rehearsals building momentum towards our Term 4 Kiwiana production, the Waikato Science Fair, the Tough Gal & Guy Challenge, Teacher Only Days, and preparations for both individual competitors and school teams heading to the Zespri NZAIMS Games.

Over the past few weeks, our school community has been significantly affected by Influenza A and a gastro bug, with some students being absent for a week or more while recovering. Both illnesses appear to be highly contagious, and we encourage families to ensure students return to school only when they are fully recovered. While we continue to focus on improving attendance and supporting students to be present and engaged in learning, the health and wellbeing of our students remain our highest priority.

Attendance data for the first five weeks of Term 3 shows a noticeable decline in regular attendance, particularly during Weeks 4 and 5. This trend aligns with the significant impact that Influenza A and the gastro bug have had across our school community, resulting in many students being absent for extended periods while recovering.

Regular attendance (91-100%) started strongly at 70.66% in Week 1 but dropped to 54.78% in Week 2 before recovering slightly to 60.36% in Week 3. However, attendance declined further to 44.82% in Week 4 and 45.33% in Week 5, representing the lowest levels of regular attendance this term.

At the same time, the proportion of students in the irregular attendance category (81-90%) increased steadily from 5.79% in Week 1 to 25.25% in Week 5. Moderate attendance rates (71-80%) also rose from 11.98% to 17.10% over the same period. The percentage of students classified as chronic attendees (below 70%) remained relatively stable, fluctuating between 11.55% and 13.94% across the five weeks.

While these figures are concerning, they reflect a period where student health and wellbeing have rightly taken priority. Families have been encouraged to keep students at home until they are fully recovered, helping to minimise further spread of illness throughout the school.

As we move into the second half of Term 3, we are hopeful that with the arrival of warmer spring weather and a reduction in seasonal illness, attendance rates will improve. Our goal remains to increase the proportion of students attending regularly and to support those students whose attendance has been impacted by illness so that we can work towards achieving our attendance targets by the end of the term.

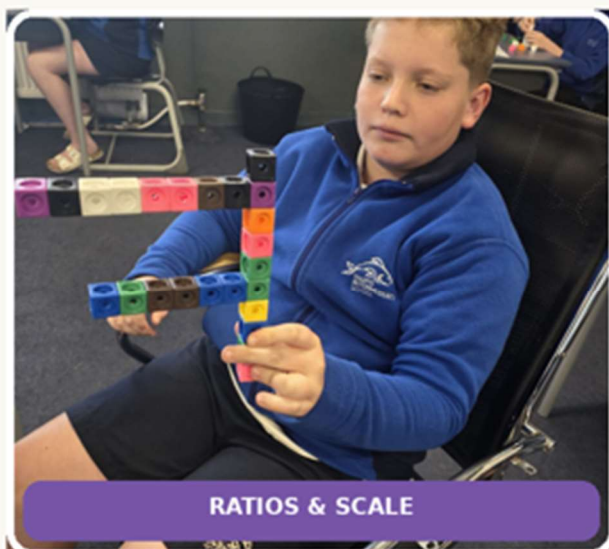
went into the match as favourites and lived up to that reputation. They played strongly, created some excellent attacking opportunities and took home the gold medal in their division.

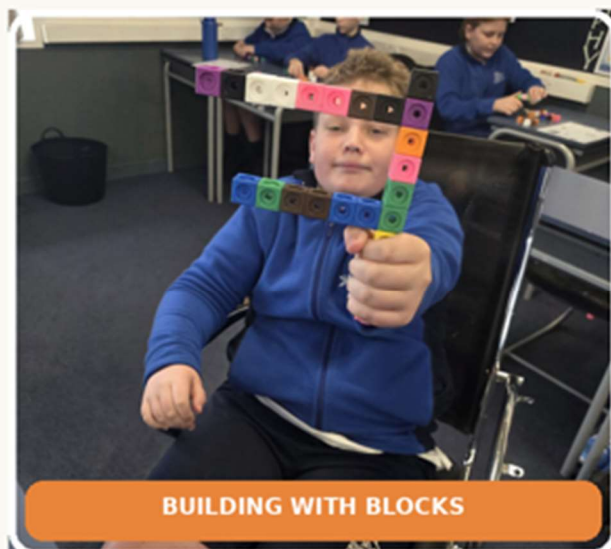

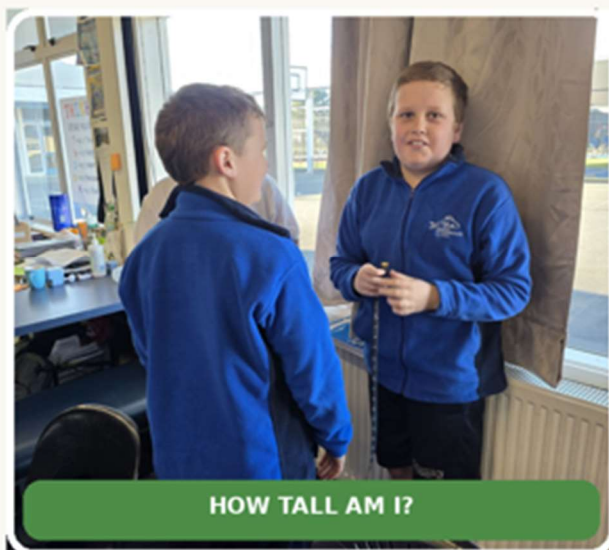

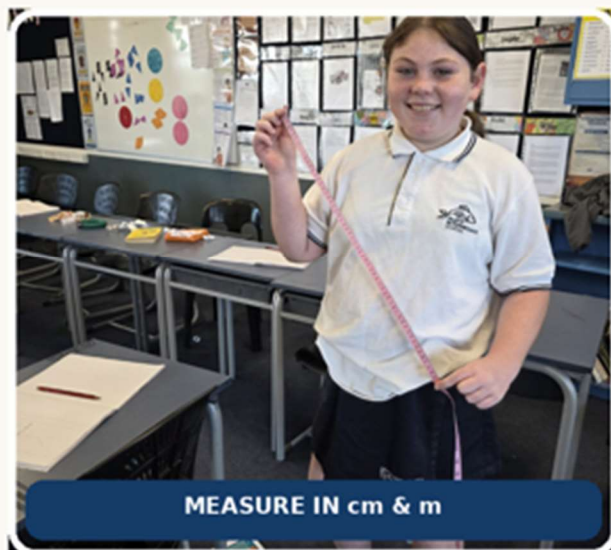
