Throughout Term 3, like many schools across New Zealand, Taupō Intermediate School has experienced the significant impact of Influenza A circulating within our community. This has resulted in higher-than-usual levels of student absence and has affected our overall attendance rates across the first six weeks of the term.

Our percentage of students attending school regularly (91-100% attendance) has decreased from 70.66% in Week 1 to 42.35% in Week 6. At the same time, the proportion of students in the irregular attendance category (81-90%) has increased from 5.79% to 29.82%, reflecting the number of students who have missed school due to illness.

While we know that regular attendance is important for student learning and achievement, we also want to acknowledge and thank families for making responsible decisions when their children are unwell. Keeping students at home until they are fully recovered is one of the most effective ways to reduce the spread of illness and protect the health and wellbeing of our school community.

We encourage families to continue supporting good attendance habits while also ensuring students have adequate time to recover before returning to school. By working together, we can help keep our students, staff, and wider community healthy and safe while maintaining strong engagement in learning.

Thank you for your ongoing support and understanding as we navigate what has been a particularly challenging winter illness season. We look forward to seeing attendance levels improve as students recover and return ready to learn.

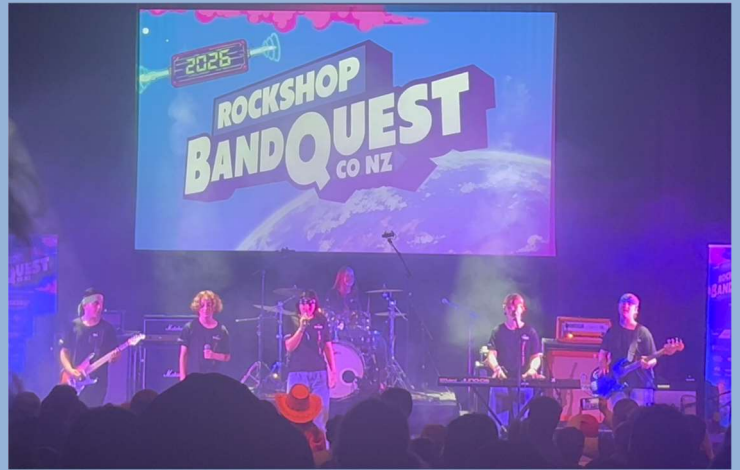
